



2021 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 52

June 24, 2021 - Introduced by Senators RINGHAND, CARPENTER and ROYS, cosponsored by Representatives SHELTON, HEBL, SINICKI, DRAKE, SPREITZER, STUBBS and CONLEY. Referred to Committee on Senate Organization.

1 **Relating to:** designating the month of March as Endosalpingiosis Awareness
2 Month.

3 Whereas, Endosalpingiosis is a rare disease that exclusively affects women,
4 mostly between the ages of 30–49 years; and

5 Whereas, Endosalpingiosis is characterized by the presence of tubal epithelium
6 outside of the fallopian tube; and

7 Whereas, the prevalence of Endosalpingiosis is difficult to establish, since it is
8 diagnosed only through surgical biopsy; and

9 Whereas, common symptoms of Endosalpingiosis include pelvic pain,
10 infertility, menstrual irregularities, and dyspareunia, along with chronic back pain
11 being reported as a common issue years before diagnosis; and

12 Whereas, some of the biggest issues that patients face are uncertainty about
13 how the condition develops and a lack of doctors who specialize in Endosalpingiosis;
