Senate Committee on Economic Development, Commerce, and Local Government

Chairman Feyen and members of the committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to discuss Senate Bill 505.

For the last two years, outstate economic development has been a legislative priority for me. I've focused on issues such as broadband internet access, which is vital for small businesses in rural areas. I've also supported bills from the Rural Wisconsin Initiative that focus on rural workforce readiness.

The bill before you today would allow the Town of Cable in Bayfield County to create a Tax Incremental District, or TID. Wisconsin law currently allows any town to create a TID as long as it meets two criteria: it must have a population of at least 3500 and the equalized value of all taxable property in the town is at least \$500 million – Cable does not meet that threshold. However, three exceptions to this standard are currently allowed: the towns of Brookfield in Waukesha County, Somers in Kenosha County, and Freedom in Outagamie County. Cable deserves the same chance these towns have been given.

Quite simply, this bill gives Cable the ability to create an economic develop project that will have major benefits for not only the town, but for much of Bayfield County in general. According to an article this week in the *Wisconsin State Journal*:

The project could create 150 to 200 construction jobs and 150 year-round positions at the resort... Once the resort reopens, officials estimate that it could increase tourism spending by \$25 million a year in Bayfield County. In 2016, tourism spending in the county was estimated at about \$42 million, according to a study commissioned by the state Department of Tourism.

You'll be hearing from the folks on the ground about the details of the impact this project would have on Bayfield County's economy. In a county where the median household income was \$46,665 in 2015, a \$25 million dollar annual boost would be an incredible economic driver.

The project's goal is to renovate the Telemark Lodge, home of the famous Birkebeiner ski race. The building has suffered over the years, going through 3 bankruptcies. Giving Cable the tools to encourage a developer to renovate the lodge and make it a tourism destination once again will turn a liability into an economic benefit. The current structure of the plan will allow the town to redevelop the property regardless of who ultimately owns it, giving Cable the ability to control its own destiny.

As you will hear from our guests today, the economics of the TID are positive. Cable is planning a pay-as-you-go project, ensuring that money is not spent up front that would become a liability if the project is not completed successfully. Town and county officials know that Cable cannot risk putting itself into a financially precarious position — any plan it puts into effect will be fiscally conservative and well-planned. The pay-as-you-go plan means the developer is on the hook for the loan, there will be no loans or bonding on the part of the town. The only money that Cable will be potentially liable for is an incremental portion of one year's TID portion of the town's property taxes.

I am confident in Cable's ability to bring in much-needed economic development with this TID. I urge you to give the town of Cable the ability to take this important step forward.

# Senate Committee on Economic Development, Commerce and Local Government Public Hearing on Senate Bill 505 December 12, 2017

Good morning Chairman Feyen and committee members. Senator Bewley couldn't be here today so she asked me to speak briefly for both of us. We are proud to be working with Senator Petrowski and Representatives Quinn and Edming on this bill. We appreciate the willingness of our colleagues to work together to help ensure that this much needed economic development project has the tools it needs to succeed.

Others will fill you in on the exciting details about the renovation and expansion of the Telemark property, including how it will affect the region and how it may be ready in time for the 2019 American Birkebeiner cross-country ski races.

Senator Bewley and I support this bipartisan bill that would give the people in Cable the resources needed to make this project successful. Changes to the state's TIF laws in the last 7 years have provided communities new avenues to pursue economic development. However, one thing that has become clear is that the limits that we set on who can use this tool are somewhat arbitrary. Cities and villages can use it, regardless of size, but only towns with an equalized value of all taxable property over \$500 million and with a population of least 3,500 can use it. The legislature has made exceptions for the towns of Brookfield in Waukesha County, Somers in Kenosha County, and Freedom in Outagamie County.

Senator Bewley and I understand that we need to protect the taxpayers and make sure that TIF districts are only used when appropriate. As you will hear today, the Town of Cable is ready and able to make this TIF district work. The TIF District, if approved, has the potential to revitalize the entire region. Thank you for your time and consideration.

## ART -

- 1. Introduction of self and expression of gratitude for the Assembly considering the bill and allowing me to speak at the hearing
- 2. A very brief and general statement of the historical importance of Telemark to the town and positive impact a redeveloped Telemark would have on the future economic well-being of the town
- 3. Town has few resources to attract a potential developer of the property and extremely limited funds to provide incentives
- 4. One resource that would be very helpful to the town is the ability to offer Tax Increment Financing to a potential developer, but as a township, we are not currently allowed to do so. I understand and appreciate the wisdom of the law, as historically, some municipalities have gotten into trouble using TIF.
- 5. In our case, however, the ability to establish a TIF district would be extremely helpful, and while the town has had no negotiations with a potential developer, we would most probably look at a pay-go structure in any agreement and a guaranteed assessed value. As such, the town would not release any money until the developer actually develops the property and pays its taxes. Then and only then would money be released. As such, the risk to the town is exponentially reduced.
- 6. Because of the reduced risk and the huge potential benefit to the town of Cable, to Bayfield County, and indeed to the entire northwest corner of the state, it is not surprising that we have letters of support from the following municipalities and agencies that we would like to submit for the record: Bayfield County, Bayfield County Economic Development Corporation, the American Birkibeiner, the Cable Area Chamber of Commerce, the Drummond Area School District, and of course, the Town of Cable. We have support from the Wisconsin Indian Head Technical College (WITC) and will be forwarding a letter from them shortly.

7. Summary statement and final expression of gratitude for the committee's consideration of this important piece of legislation

### Mark -

#### **Dear Committee Members**

- 1. Bayfield County is the Northernmost County in the State of Wisconsin with over 1500 square miles of natural forested beauty, 960 inland lakes and 80 miles of Lake Superior shoreline. Our region is a wonderland.
- 2. Our economy is based on forestry and tourism. Demographic trends show our communities to be aging faster than the rest of the state. Projections for 2030 predict a declining population.
- 3. The Cable region has a strong history of trails, lakes and allseason opportunities. The redevelopment of Telemark will benefit our region as a whole by providing jobs through a variety of business opportunities.
- 4. Bayfield County believes that the proposed TID legislation enabling this redevelopment will benefit local government, business and residents in both the short and long term.
- 5. We believe this is a prime example of how a TID district will clearly create economic development and result in higher valuations, allowing for local government, schools and counties to provide quality services at reasonable costs.
- Bayfield County supports this legislation and asks for your consideration.

## Scottie -

- 1. I am Scottie Sandstrom, Executive Director of the Bayfield County Economic Development Corporation. Thanks for this opportunity to be here today to encourage support for the Town of Cable having the ability to create a TIF district for the Telemark project.
- 2. Mark Abeles-Allison, Bayfield County Administrator was unable to attend and has asked me to read a short statement on behalf of the county.
- 3. The Bayfield County Economic Development Corporation's mission is to improve the economic climate by supporting new and existing businesses. The re-development of the iconic Telemark Resort in the Town of Cable in southern Bayfield County truly aligns to that mission.
- 4. I have known the developers of this project since February 2014, and have supported them in their steady progress to bring this project steadily forward. I feel they have the ability to bring new life into Telemark to the benefit of our region for years to come.
- 5. Key Points Regarding the Re-development
  - a) Telemark Development Partners plans to re-develop and reposition Telemark as a four-season destination resort with full year activities and amenities
  - b) The \$47MM project will include;
    - maintaining and updating the core lodge with new restaurants and amenities
    - demolishing the existing rooms (both wings)
    - creating 250 deluxe guest rooms for suitable to today's traveler
    - creating over 20,000 sq. ft. of dedicated training center, flexible conference and social event space.
- 6. Economic Impact

- a) Telemark will create a new tax base for Bayfield County and the state, assisting in adding significant dollars to both local and state coffers. Dollars that can go back to support both local and state projects.
- b) Initially, it is anticipated that 150 to 200 construction jobs will be created within the area in support of the renovations prior to the re-opening of the resort.
- c) The project will create between 100 and 120 full time employees and up to 60-part time employees created within 2 -3 years.
- d) It is projected that direct visitor impact spending will increase from \$42MM annually to over \$67MM annually with the re-opening of this complex.
- e) Based on an estimated hard construction cost of \$38MM to rebuild the lodge, rooms and conference center and assuming a conservative assessed value of 75% of construction cost the project is projected to generate \$300,000 in local assessed value to local taxing entities in the Town of Cable and Bayfield County on an annual basis.
- 7. The re-development of Telemark is poised to be a crucial economic driver for the Town of Cable, Bayfield County, and the entire Northwestern Wisconsin region for years to come. I thank you in advance for your support in passage of this bill to assist the Town of Cable to create a TIF District for this project.

## James -

- 1) Good Morning Chairman Feyen and members of the committee. I would like to thank all of you for hearing Senate Bill 505 this morning to allow the Town of Cable to create a Tax Incremental District in the same manner as a village or city. My name is James Bolen. I am the Executive Director for the Cable Area Chamber of Commerce. I also serve on the Governor's Council on Tourism and am the Chairman of the states Sports Marketing Committee. I thought it wise to give you a better understanding of the Town of Cable and the region where it resides.
- 2) Tourism drives the economy for Cable, Bayfield County and most of Northern Wisconsin. The Town of Cable is surrounded by the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest. The Town of Cable is small in size but not in stature! It is a renowned tourism destination, recognized by CNN as one of the top places in the U.S. to cross country ski and by USA Today as one of the top 10 places to mountain bike in America. It is a charter member of "TrailtownUSA", one of only 30 municipalities in the country to receive this designation. The Cable Area is home to the most prestigious mountain bike race in North America, the Chequamegon Fat Tire Festival, the starting point for the largest cross-country ski race in North or South America, The American Birkebeiner and home to the largest Fat Bike race in the World, the Fat Bike Birkie. A 2014 case study completed by the UW found that silent sport enthusiasts alone pumped over 21 million dollars annually into the Town of Cable and the surrounding area. The heart of those silent sports trails sits upon the Telemark Resort property.
- 3) The Cable Area is also known for its majestic waters. Lake Owen has been recognized by the DNR as the 'healthiest' of Wisconsin's 15,000 lakes and Lake Namakagon is one of only 3 trophy musky lakes in our state. Lake Namakagon is also the headwaters for the Namakagon River which is the countries only moving National Park. The Namakagon River flows near the famed Telemark Resort property and a canoe/kayak landing is only ¼ mile from the lodges front door.
- 4) The Town of Cable hosted the International Paralympic Committee's Nordic World Cup in 2012 and when the Country of Poland was unable to fulfill the duties of hosting a World Cup in 2013, every countries Olympic Committee requested that the event return to Cable. With only 2 months advance notice to prepare the Cable Area hosted an amazing World Cup and the International Paralympic Committee later told us they didn't believe any

other venue could have pulled off what we did. In 2015 we hosted the International Paralympic Committee's Nordic World Championships. With regards to grandeur, scope and complexity of competition only the Winter Olympic or Paralympic Games is bigger than the event held in Cable in 2015. Once the Telemark Resort is re-vitalized, it will represent the only large-scale lodging facility at a major Nordic competition venue in the World. The potential to attract numerous large-scale events is hard to overstate.

- 5) The proposed Telemark project is expected to increase direct visitor spending by 25 million dollars annually and the lodge could also potentially spend 1.5 million dollars with other local vendors in support of lodge operations. The project will also increase the total number of tourism jobs in Bayfield County by 33%.
- 6) This is a major tourism project in a part of the state that is driven by tourism, which is why we have submitted letters of support for this legislation from communities stretching from Superior to Park Falls, Ashland to Hayward. The region recognizes that the Town of Cable is the small town that doesn't know it. If there was ever an argument for allowing a town to act like a village it is for the Town of Cable. For the sake of the entire region, I ask you to vote in favor of giving the Town of Cable the ability to act like a village or city in regard to a Tax Incremental District.

#### Ben -

"HK's current plans for Telemark could position the resort as a hub for numerous silent sports events at the local, national and international levels. Upon final plans coming to fruition, the American Birkebeiner Ski Foundation plans to collaborate with HK to redevelop forgotten trails, to make snow, and to grow silent sport and recreational opportunities in northwest Wisconsin. From an event planning perspective, having a 250-room lodge near the Birkie Trail would enhance the overall Birkie (and our other 8 events) experience for participants and spectators, ultimately driving economic growth in the region", stated Ben Popp, Executive Director, American Birkebeiner Ski Foundation.

- 1) Work together on creating a ski venue with man-made snow to host regional and national events attracting new and ensuring current.
- 2) Provide a lodging facility that can host group, corporate and social events and provide a "Headquarters Resort" facility that befits the American Birkebeiner events.
- 3) There is need for a head quarter hotel at the site of the Birkie and Fat tire events
