Testimony on Senate Bill 662

Chairman Nass and members of the Senate Committee on Labor and Regulatory Reform, thank you for taking the time today to hear Senate Bill 662.

This time last year, throughout Wisconsin we were all celebrating our essential workers and praising them for their hard work and dedication as they showed up to work day after day. These workers risked their health to help keep our communities on their feet – from healthcare workers to grocery store employees and every other essential industry in-between.

Since then, we've come a long way in our fight against COVID-19. Unfortunately though, we've also managed to regress in a number of areas, including: how we treat Wisconsinites who choose not to receive the vaccine; how we allow employers to have the ability to fire essential employees who were heroes just last year, solely based on their vaccination status; and how the public views and discusses natural immunity.

According to a Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) article titled *Science Brief: SARS-CoV-2 Infection-induced and Vaccine-induced immunity*, updated on October 29th of 2021, "available evidence shows that fully vaccinated individuals and those previously infected with SARS-CoV-2 each have a low risk of subsequent infection for at least 6 months."

To break it down:

If you have been infected with COVID-19, you are still susceptible to the virus, you can still spread the virus, and according to the CDC you "have a low risk of subsequent infection for at least six months."

Now let's look at the vaccine. If you're vaccinated, you are still susceptible to the virus, you can still spread the virus, and you "have a low risk of subsequent infection for at least six months."

The biggest difference between natural immunity and the vaccine that I can see is that one is a natural response produced by the body, and the other was created in a lab by large pharmaceutical corporations.

Senate Bill 662 would require employers who mandate the COVID-19 vaccination or regular COVID-19 testing as a condition of employment to accept documentation demonstrating natural immunity as an alternative. Documentation can include proof of a positive COVID-19 test or documentation of a serology test that shows the presence of naturally occurring antibodies against COVID-19 in the individual's blood. Both forms must be signed by a healthcare provider licensed in the United States or a territory of the United States.

I'd like to thank Representative Horlacher, my co-author, for his work on this bill and am happy to take any questions.

2021 Senate Bill 662 Testimony of Representative Cody Horlacher January 11, 2022

Chairman Nass and members of the Senate Committee on Labor and Regulatory Reform, thank you for the opportunity to testify before you today on Senate Bill 662.

I have heard from my neighbors and constituents, as well as from people across the state, about the negative impacts of COVID vaccine mandates. Both employers and employees have been forced into making moral and health decisions contrary to their want, and contrary to their judgement. Whether its health, economics, or mass pressure, forcing people into health decisions against their free will is contrary to the fundamental values of our democracy.

In particular, many of the healthcare workers forced into other positions because of their stance against forced vaccinations worked throughout all of 2020 without a vaccine and worked many times with subpar PPE. And yet these same people who were lauded as heroes last year are fired or threatened with being fired a year later when they refuse to be vaccinated.

The whole point of vaccination is to prevent getting the disease. As we see all too often today, the vaccinated are still contracting and spreading the disease. We ought to call this vaccine a therapeutic if it doesn't actually prevent people from getting the disease. This is much like taking supplements or increasing healthy lifestyle changes to help ward off or lessen the ill effects. Vaccine is a misnomer, and getting it should be left to the discretion of those who have not had the disease yet.

We do not mandate the chickenpox vaccine for people who have already contracted that disease, and we should not do so here.

It's time to put the question of vaccinations behind us, and look forward to getting our families back to work to support our communities, and not cast them out for not being vaccinated; particularly if they have already contracted and recovered from the disease in the first place.

Dear Chairman Nass and Members of the Committee:

On behalf of the American Cancer Society Cancer Action Network (ACS CAN), thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony on SB 662 – a piece of legislation that could place the health of cancer patients at greater risk.

ACS CAN represents millions of patients, cancer survivors and their families nationwide, including 36,520 Wisconsinites who will be diagnosed with cancer this year. Many cancer patients and their families have been hard hit by the COVID-19 pandemic which has placed them at substantial risk for severe illness. Cancer treatments – from chemotherapy to immunotherapy to bone marrow transplants – often weaken a patient’s immune system, making cancer patients especially vulnerable to communicable illnesses like COVID-19. A survey of cancer patients and survivors last summer found that two-thirds of patients, and many caregivers, were worried about protecting their health from COVID-19. Those worries, combined with disruptions in health care services, have led many cancer patients to delay or forego treatment.

Fortunately, the availability of a COVID-19 vaccine will mean many cancer patients can be protected from the virus and resume their normal treatments safely. But we don’t yet know how effective vaccines may be in people being treated for cancer. It is possible that cancer patients – or others with weakened immune systems – may not be fully protected even if they are vaccinated. A recent study from the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society found that one in four blood cancer patients fail to produce detectable antibodies after COVID-19 vaccination. This makes it even more critical that as many healthy people as possible are fully vaccinated to protect those who are unable to be vaccinated or for whom the vaccine may be less effective.

The health and safety of people with cancer as well as our staff is our top priority. To protect our constituents who are at high risk for the most serious outcomes from COVID-19, the American Cancer Society and ACS CAN are requiring vaccines for all staff, as well as volunteers who interact with cancer patients in our Road to Recovery patient transportation program.

Vague and subjective exemptions from vaccine requirements, like the proposal for an employer to accept “natural immunity” in lieu of vaccination or test for COVID-19 in SB 662 would slow, perhaps even prevent, the protection of cancer patients, even where it is needed most – in health care settings. If passed and implemented, SB 662 would undermine our ability to protect our constituents who are already facing a life-threatening illness.

We urge this committee to reject this legislation.

Testimony of the American Lung Association
Opposing Senate Bill 662
Senate Committee on Labor and Regulatory Reform

Dear Chair Nass and members of the committee,

When we found ourselves in the midst of a respiratory pandemic in 2020, the American Lung Association knew we had an important role. We launched a \$25 million campaign to end COVID-19 and defend against future respiratory virus pandemics, funding research awards and grants for preventative research as well as working to evaluate the effects of COVID-19 on patients with chronic lung disease. We have worked in coalition with government, private industry, and public health organizations to address this pandemic on every level.

Senate Bill 662 proposes that, for employment purposes, infection-induced immunity be treated the same as vaccination. While current evidence suggests that reinfection with COVID-19 is uncommon in the 90 days after the initial infection, experts are unsure how long this protection lasts.

An [August 2021 study](#) of people who had recovered from COVID-19 “shows that unvaccinated individuals are more than twice as likely to be reinfected with COVID-19 than those who were fully vaccinated after initially contracting the virus. These data further indicate that COVID-19 vaccines offer better protection than natural immunity alone and that vaccines, even after prior infection, help prevent reinfections.”

Our public policies should focus on encouraging individuals to get vaccinated. [Over 204 million people in the United States are fully vaccinated](#), and billions of people worldwide have received the vaccine. The vaccines have undergone the most intensive safety monitoring in U.S. history. The [evidence is clear](#) that they reduce the risk of hospitalizations and deaths from COVID-19, as well as the risk of contracting and spreading the virus.

As the trusted champion for lung health, the American Lung Association is focused on slowing the spread and defeating COVID-19. To further protect the overall population and those most vulnerable, we need a sufficiently high proportion of the population to get vaccinated to stop coronavirus transmission. We hope you will work to protect the health and safety of all Wisconsinites by encouraging everyone to consider getting vaccinated and boosted.

Testimony in Support of SB 662

I am writing in support of Wisconsin State Senate Bill 662 relating to proof of natural immunity to Covid-19 in lieu of proof of vaccination or test.

I have been a practicing physician in the State of Wisconsin for over twenty five years and, like most of you, have been trying to analyze the evolving scientific data on the Covid-19 pandemic for these last two years. As we have taken care of affected patients we physicians have had to be flexible in our approach to this unprecedented event and, although we have learned much, we have made some mistakes as well as achieved some great scientific victories.

As background I would like to discuss our scientific understanding of the immune response to a Covid-19 infection and compare it to the immunity conferred by the available vaccines. We have learned that the Covid-19 virus enters the host cells by a section (the "spike protein") attaching to an ACE receptor on the patients cellular membrane. These ACE receptors are in higher concentrations in the respiratory tract and are present in higher concentrations in adults vs. children explaining the patterns of infection observed during the pandemic. Our current vaccines inject a protein sequence from this spike protein and stimulate our cells to make copies that will create a robust immune response with the production of IgG and IgM antibodies. The antibodies target the unique proteins in the Covid-19 "spike" region and circulate for months as active surveillance against a real Covid-19 infectious event. We have learned that vaccines confer immunity not from the possibility of infection but insofar as they decrease the risk of hospitalization and death as compared to the unvaccinated. The probable reason that the vaccinated are still susceptible to possible Covid-19 infection is that that the virus itself is more than just the small number of proteins in the "spike" portion. Therefore it seems that vaccine derived immunity is probably incomplete. Additionally, the "spike" proteins as well as the rest of the virus are susceptible to mutations or "variants" as we have seen with Delta and most recently Omicron.

In comparison, when someone is infected by the Covid-19 virus, their immune system is exposed to ALL of the virus' intricate protein antigens, not just the "spike". It has been demonstrated in as many as 141 published medical studies from around the world (see included) that the immune response from surviving a Covid-19 infection is more robust than that conferred by vaccination. Further, from previous experience with SARS Covid-1, there is some evidence that survival from an infection may confer long-term, even life-long immunity through T cell and B cell "sleepers" cells that reside in our bone marrow and lymphatics. In an Israeli study from their National Health Service Data, patients with natural immunity from previous infection were found to be many times less likely to be re-infected compared to those vaccinated without a previous infection. The naturally immune had a reinfection rate of 0.015% as compared to the infection rate among the vaccinated but not previously infected of 0.07%. The number of severe cases were also higher among the vaccinated than the naturally immune: .9% vs .5%. A study from Qatar examined a cohort of 353,000 people using national databases which included people who had PCR (Polymerase Chain Reaction) test confirmed Covid-19 infection and found the risk of re-infection to be 0.4% among the unvaccinated with

natural immunity. Their chance of severe disease was 0.1 times that of a primary infection with no deaths reported.

They concluded:

“for a person who has already had a primary infection, the risk of having a severe.

Reinfection is only approximately 1% of the risk of a previously uninfected person”

Closer to home, the Cleveland Clinic has done a study of 52,238 employees comparing infection among vaccinated and unvaccinated employees with known previous Covid-19 infection. They observed that there was not one episode of reinfection among the employees with natural immunity.

They concluded:

“Individuals who have had SARS -Covid-2 infection are unlikely to benefit from Covid-19 vaccination, and vaccines can be safely prioritized to those who have not been infected.”

Perhaps the largest and most cited is a recent study from Israel that found that in 673,676 patients, people who recovered from Covid-19 and remained unvaccinated were 27 times less likely to experience symptomatic re-infection from the Delta variant when compared to those who had not been infected and had received two doses of the Pfizer-Bio N Tech vaccine. The science on comparative immunity is now clear and undeniable.

With regard to the claim that the unvaccinated pose a greater public risk for spreading Covid-19, there is substantial data to refute the idea of asymptomatic spread. A recent study by Rierasma, et.al. from the University of Wisconsin demonstrated that the vaccinated are showing viral loads comparable to the unvaccinated, and that the vaccinated are equally infectious to others. They observed that the vaccinated can and are transmit(ing) SARS Covid-19 to others equally to the unvaccinated. In July, there was report of an outbreak among Finnish hospital health care workers in a setting of fully vaccinated individuals with full time masking. Again in Israel an outbreak among a highly vaccinated population of healthcare workers was reported. They found:

“The calculated attack rate among all exposed patients and staff was 10.6% for staff and 23.7% for patients in a population with 96.2% vaccination rate.”

There is significant available evidence that the oropharyngeal viral load among those vaccinated or unvaccinated is the same. That is, either can be equally infectious to others.

It has become increasingly clear from the world-wide available scientific data that the overriding benefit of vaccination for Covid-19 is to the recipient of the vaccine alone not to others. The vaccinated are safer in avoiding severe infection, hospitalization or death but are not immune from infection. They are as likely to spread Covid-19 as the unvaccinated. The vaccinated who have never had Covid-19 are more likely to have a breakthrough infection than a person who is unvaccinated but has recovered from Covid-19 (has natural immunity). The data seems to show that the best long-term immunity is among those who have natural immunity.

Around the world, the approach to population safety during the pandemic has varied dramatically. In the UK, attendance at large events such as Wimbledon was approved for those with proof of vaccination or of previous Covid-19 infection. The EU allows proof of vaccination or natural immunity as evidence for a "vaccine passport".

As you review the merits of the proposed bill please be aware that the worldwide scientific data has become increasingly clear that individuals with natural immunity from previous infection have at the very least equivalent protection from Covid-19 as the vaccinated. The most reasonable approach- one that would "follow the science"- would be to accept proof of prior Covid-19 test positivity as proof of immunity and complying with any employer or governmental mandate. Hello and thank you Senator Nass for holding this important public hearing. And thank you to the members of this committee for being here today to listen.

My name is Denise Brusveen. I reside in Columbia County, and I am a wife, a mother of three, a county board supervisor, and the co-founder of Vaccine Choice Wisconsin, an organization dedicated to ensuring that vaccination is always a choice from conception to natural death.

I am saddened that we are even in this position needing to have bills introduced that protect one's right to forego a vaccination for an illness that roughly 20% of our state has already tested positive for, and countless others have been infected with and recovered from without testing, and thus without counting toward our state's recorded case totals.

COVID vaccine mandates are not only an overreach of our right to personal bodily autonomy, but they make absolutely no sense because they have never been proven to prevent infection or the spread of infection. They literally were not even tested for this purpose. They may, in some cases, reduce the SEVERITY of infection, but even this is questionable.

The only person out of over a hundred that I know who have been infected in the past two months who was hospitalized was fully vaccinated.

But I digress. If this vaccine does not prevent infection nor the spread of infection, why on earth would implementing mandates in the workplace be of any benefit to the company? It only serves to infringe on the privacy of personal medical information, pits people against one another, and gives a false sense of security to individuals who believe that this vaccine is meant to prevent infection.

Case in point, at a county board committee meeting just yesterday, one of our department heads was questioning whether or not individuals should be sharing hotel rooms at an upcoming conference as they typically would have prior to COVID. Then he stated that they should be fine because they are all vaccinated and boosted.

This troubled me for two reasons. First, as I just stated, the vaccine is not meant to prevent infection or the spread of infection, so one's vaccination status would have no impact on any perceived risk of sharing a hotel room or not. Second, why is it ok that he disclose private medical information about county employees without their knowledge or consent?

My husband's employer asked all employees to report their vaccination status in November. Earlier in the fall, as part of our health insurance enrollment for the year, his employer added the COVID antibody test to the bloodwork that they already have required for the previous several years in order to get the lowest health insurance rate (even though the results of this bloodwork do not affect the rate itself). Thankfully, we figured out a way to opt out, but I am sure that countless individuals were not aware of this option.

I feel strongly that it is not an employer's right to even know one's vaccination status or their immunity status, let alone to implement testing, masking, or vaccine mandates based on one's status.

I'm actually shocked that my husband's employer has not enforced a vaccine mandate yet. Perhaps they discovered that a majority of the company already has natural antibodies through their testing. Or perhaps the only thing saving them from a mandate is that they are so short-staffed that they cannot afford to lose anyone else who may choose to resign over a mandate.

SB547 is a bill that my family and many others would rely on should a mandate take effect while they search for a new job. Thus, I support SB547.

I also support SB662, but ONLY if both amendments that have been offered by Rep. Wichgers are included. Without those amendments, this bill sounds a lot like Nazi Germany – "show me your papers."

Just two years ago, hundreds of people filled a hearing room here in the capitol over a proposed DHS rule change that would require proof of immunity to chickenpox by a doctor in order for a child to forego that vaccination. Thankfully JCRAR objected. Yet here we are fighting for something so similar for adults.

Whether it be chickenpox, influenza, or COVID, many families like mine do not run off to the doctor to get a diagnosis every time we get sick. We simply stay home while we are sick until we are recovered. Asking for proof of immunity either with a positive test during an active infection or via blood work to show antibodies would add a financial burden to many families if the testing was required at their own expense. And, as I mentioned earlier, this should not be an employer's business just like an employer is not allowed to ask about someone's HIV or herpes or gonorrhea status even though all of these things can be considered contagious.

Finally, I support SB721 even though it only scratches the surface. I personally feel that employers should not only be responsible for unemployment benefits but should also be required to pay for all associated medical expenses as well. However, I'm guessing that very few injuries will even be

attributed to the vaccine since the burden of proof will lie with the injured victim, and we know that doctors and hospitals have a long history of refusing to properly attribute injuries to vaccines.

In summary, I support SB547, SB662 (with both amendments), and SB721. I hope that this is just the beginning and that you, our legislature, will soon pass even more protective bills like SB336 so that none of these bills today are even necessary.

To The Committee on Labor and Regulatory Reform,

Thank you for holding today's hearing regarding Senate Bills 547, 662, 721. I submit this written testimony today in support of these 3 bills, and ask you to support these bills as well. I have spent the past 8 years working as a nurse practitioner at Children's Wisconsin, and have witnessed first-hand the devastation these current COVID-19 vaccine mandates have put on our staff and providers. Since the pandemic began, I have witnessed our staff go to amazing lengths to provide the best and safest care to our patients. Unfortunately, due to these mandates, our dedicated staff members were forced out of jobs that they loved, and are now deemed "unfit" to provide care.

Regarding SB 547, staff members were terminated on November 15th, 2021, if they did not comply with the vaccine mandate, or have an accepted religious waiver. These staff members who were terminated are now being denied unemployment. As stated in their unemployment denial "The employee quit but not for a reason which would allow the payment of benefits. Based on the best available information, the employee quit her job when she refused to comply with the employer's COVID-19 vaccination requirement. She was aware she needed to receive the vaccination to keep her employment. While she may have had valid personal reasons for quitting, it could not be found that any exceptions under unemployment law apply". It is morally and ethically wrong to deny healthcare workers unemployment benefits after they spent nearly two years putting their personal health and safety at risk to provide healthcare to the general public. When there were massive shortages of personal protective equipment (PPE), our healthcare workers did not second guess their personal safety. They did what was necessary to provide the best and safest care to their patients and put their own health and safety secondary.

Regarding SB 662, many healthcare workers have developed natural immunity to COVID-19, as they have been exposed in the workplace setting. However, natural immunity is being denied as sufficient protection for healthcare workers, even as more studies are emerging that identify natural immunity to be more robust and longer lasting than vaccine-induced immunity. Previously in healthcare, we have honored natural immunity as sufficient evidence of protection, such as a measurable Varicella IgG being an acceptable substitute for the Varicella vaccine. It is only during this current COVID pandemic that we are ignoring the honest discussion and consideration of natural immunity as safe and protective. Furthermore, our staff who have been granted vaccine exemption waivers must now participate in mandatory weekly COVID testing, including staff who work 100% remotely. We now know that people vaccinated against COVID-19 are still capable of contracting and spreading COVID to others. The vaccine serves as a protective measure for the individual but offers no benefit to the general public, so why are only the unvaccinated being forced to test, when the vaccinated are capable of spreading COVID to their patients? The mandatory COVID testing of only unvaccinated staff is being used as a tool by employers to

eventually force the employee into getting the vaccine to avoid this invasive, repetitive testing, or to lead to the employee's eventual departure.

Regarding SB 721, healthcare workers are currently being coerced into vaccination as condition of employment, and the simply ability to provide for themselves and their families. There have been thousands of submissions of adverse reactions submitted to the CDC and FDA's VAERS database. I have also witnessed firsthand adverse side effects and medical complications related to the COVID vaccine. Most recently as November 2021, the FDA requested to have 55 years to fully release the data used to license Pfizer's COVID vaccine. There is an egregious lack of transparency from the pharmaceutical companies and certain government agencies regarding all of the data surrounding this vaccine. Until we have thorough, transparent and timely reporting of all COVID vaccine data, we should not be blindly mandating this vaccine for any and all persons to maintain employment. We cannot deny our honest Wisconsin citizens of worker's compensation when many of them chose the vaccine out of desperation to maintain employment and benefits needed to continue providing for their families.

As a lifelong Wisconsin resident and healthcare provider, I ask you to uphold our rights as citizens and step in with regards to vaccinations for COVID-19. Dear Senator Nass and Committee Members:

I am writing on behalf of the Freedom From Religion Foundation (FFRF) and our local membership to urge you to reject Senate Bill 662. FFRF is a Madison-based national nonprofit organization with more than 35,000 members across the country, including more than 1,500 members in Wisconsin. FFRF protects the constitutional separation between state and church, and educates about nontheism.

S.B. 662 rests entirely on the flawed assumption that “natural,” infected-induced immunity to SARS-CoV-2, which causes COVID-19, is comparable to vaccination. Scientists have measured and compared the two, and have found that vaccines provide far greater immunity.¹ This, of course, is in addition to the fact that acquiring “natural” immunity by contracting the virus *requires one to contract the virus*, jeopardizing not only their own health and life, but also those of other Wisconsinites by taking up limited space at hospitals amidst a surge in the pandemic. In other words, contracting the virus spreads the virus and exacerbates the pandemic; vaccines do precisely the opposite.



Opposing Senate Bill 662

Dear Chair Nass and members of the committee,

When we found ourselves in the midst of a respiratory pandemic in 2020, the American Lung Association knew we had an important role. We launched a \$25 million campaign to end COVID-19 and defend against future respiratory virus pandemics, funding research awards and grants for preventative research as well as working to evaluate the effects of COVID-19 on patients with chronic lung disease. We have worked in coalition with government, private industry, and public health organizations to address this pandemic on every level.

Senate Bill 662 proposes that, for employment purposes, infection-induced immunity be treated the same as vaccination. While current evidence suggests that reinfection with COVID-19 is uncommon in the 90 days after the initial infection, experts are unsure how long this protection lasts.

An August 2021 study of people who had recovered from COVID-19 "shows that unvaccinated individuals are more than twice as likely to be reinfected with COVID-19 than those who were fully vaccinated after initially contracting the virus. These data further indicate that COVID-19 vaccines offer better protection than natural immunity alone and that vaccines, even after prior infection, help prevent reinfections."

Our public policies should focus on encouraging individuals to get vaccinated. Over 204 million people in the United States are fully vaccinated, and billions of people worldwide have received the vaccine. The vaccines have undergone the most intensive safety monitoring in U.S. history. The evidence is clear that they reduce the risk of hospitalizations and deaths from COVID-19, as well as the risk of contracting and spreading the virus.

As the trusted champion for lung health, the American Lung Association is focused on slowing the spread and defeating COVID-19. To further protect the overall population and those most vulnerable, we need a sufficiently high proportion of the population to get vaccinated to stop coronavirus transmission. We hope you will work to protect the health and safety of all Wisconsinites by encouraging everyone to consider getting vaccinated and boosted.

To The Committee on Labor and Regulatory Reform,

Thank you for holding today's hearing regarding Senate Bills 547, 662, 721. I submit this written testimony today in support of these 3 bills, and ask you to support these bills as well. I have spent the past 8 years working as a nurse practitioner at Children's Wisconsin, and have witnessed firsthand the devastation these current COVID-19 vaccine mandates have put on our staff and providers. Since the pandemic began, I have witnessed our staff go to amazing lengths to provide the best and safest care to our patients. Unfortunately, due to these mandates, our dedicated staff members were forced out of jobs that they loved, and are now deemed "unfit" to provide care.

Regarding SB 547, staff members were terminated on November 15th, 2021, if they did not comply with the vaccine mandate, or have an accepted religious waiver. These staff members who were terminated are now being denied unemployment. As stated in their unemployment denial "The employee quit but not for a reason which would allow the payment of benefits. Based on the best available information, the employee quit her job when she refused to comply with the employer's COVID-19 vaccination requirement. She was aware she needed to receive the vaccination to keep her employment. While she may have had valid personal reasons for quitting, it could not be found that any exceptions under unemployment law apply". It is morally and ethically wrong to deny healthcare workers unemployment benefits after they spent nearly two years putting their personal health and safety at risk to provide healthcare to the general public. When there were massive shortages of personal protective equipment (PPE), our healthcare workers did not second guess their personal safety. They did what was necessary to provide the best and safest care to their patients and put their own health and safety secondary.

Regarding SB 662, many healthcare workers have developed natural immunity to COVID-19, as they have been exposed in the workplace setting. However, natural immunity is being denied as sufficient protection for healthcare workers, even as more studies are emerging that identify natural immunity to be more robust and longer lasting than vaccine-induced immunity. Previously in healthcare, we have honored natural immunity as sufficient evidence of protection, such as a measurable Varicella IgG being an acceptable substitute for the Varicella vaccine. It is only during this current COVID pandemic that we are ignoring the honest discussion and consideration of natural immunity as safe and protective. Furthermore, our staff who have been granted vaccine exemption waivers must now participate in mandatory weekly COVID testing, including staff who work 100% remotely. We now know that people vaccinated against COVID-19 are still capable of contracting and spreading COVID to others. The vaccine serves as a protective measure for the individual but offers no benefit to the general public, so why are only the unvaccinated being forced to test, when the vaccinated are capable of spreading COVID to their patients? The mandatory COVID testing of only unvaccinated staff is being used as a tool by employers to

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Submission to the Wisconsin Senate Committee on Labor and Regulatory Reform Support of SB547 and SB721 - Amendments to SB662 - January 11, 2022 By Judith Jolly, RN, BSN - Wisconsin State Director

My name is Judith Jolly and I am a resident of Pardeeville Wisconsin. I am a registered nurse with a Bachelor of Science in nursing and the Wisconsin State Director and the Director of Diseases and Vaccine Website Content for the National Vaccine Information Center, the nation's oldest vaccine safety and informed consent advocacy organization. For 40 years, the national charitable non-profit NVIC has been dedicated to preventing vaccine injuries and deaths through public education and advocating for informed consent protections in medical policies and public health laws.

I am speaking on SB662 and am respectfully requesting that this committee adopt Assembly Substitute Amendment One of AB675. This would permit an individual to sign a notarized letter that states that the individual, to the best of their knowledge has recovered from COVID-19 and would require employers to notify employees of their right to provide proof of natural immunity instead of proof of vaccination. It would also ensure that individuals who are not discriminated against for providing proof of natural immunity. I am also speaking in support of SB547 and SB721. While SB662 offers many COVID-19 immune individuals protections against vaccine mandates that have the potential to cause them additional harm, language in Assembly Substitute Amendment One is necessary to ensure that ALL COVID-19 immune individuals are protected. There are many individuals who developed symptoms of COVID-19 and recovered without seeking medical treatment or testing to confirm a diagnosis.

There are no commonly-used COVID-19 tests that can detect with absolute certainty that a person is immune to the virus. While antibody testing may prove immunity, the absence of antibodies does not necessarily mean that a person is not immune. Antibodies can wane, but on re-exposure to the virus, may mount a response.¹ We know that nucleic acid amplification tests, polymerase chain reaction tests, commonly referred to as PCR tests, and antigen tests are susceptible to false positive and false negative results and the exact number of false results is not known. These tests have also been found to be incapable of distinguishing between live viruses and viral particles, and between SARS-CoV-2 and other viruses.² Symptoms of COVID-19, which often include loss of taste or smell or respiratory distress are easily recognizable,³ especially if a person has had a known exposure to someone who was diagnosed with COVID-19. Additionally, there are over-the-counter home COVID-19 tests that do not require a third party to verify results. Some infected individuals may have used a personal home test and chosen not to seek additional medical testing or care following a positive result. The language in Assembly Amendment One protects medical and personal privacy, and while there is a presumption that the individual is genuine in their belief that they had COVID-19, by requiring the form to be notarized, there is some degree of accountability and consequences for a false statement.

We know for certain that COVID-19 vaccination does not guarantee immunity. Studies and real-world data have shown that the currently available COVID-19 vaccines are incapable of preventing infections and stopping transmission of SARS-CoV-2. The CDC has acknowledged that fully vaccinated people can still become infected with the SARS-CoV-2 virus and spread it to others.⁴ A year-long study published in late October 2021 found that the Delta variant is still highly transmissible among vaccinated individuals and that vaccinated people could still contract and transmit the infection within households and even to other vaccinated people.⁵ A study conducted this past July in Wisconsin found that viral loads were identical between vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals who developed symptoms of COVID-19 illness.⁶ A pre-print study from Denmark has found that the Omicron variant spreads even faster than Delta among fully vaccinated and boosted individuals.⁷

Scientific evidence has shown that after six months, all of the COVID-19 vaccines are less than 50 percent effective at preventing infection.^{8 9 10 11} That is why the public is being told to get a booster dose. However, even boosters are failing to protect. There are countless reports of fully vaccinated and boosted individuals developing symptomatic COVID-19 illness.^{12 13} However, we rarely hear stories of persons with natural immunity developing a second COVID-19 infection. The CDC has even acknowledged that they have no evidence that any person with natural immunity due to past infection has been able to transmit the virus to another individual.¹⁴

There are now well over 100 pre-print and published studies that prove natural immunity to be equal to or superior to vaccine-acquired immunity.¹⁵ The Louisiana Federal Court that halted the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services rule that would require COVID-19 vaccination for many healthcare workers noted that *"these studies overwhelmingly conclude that*



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*natural immunity provides equivalent or greater protection against severe infection than immunity generated by COVID-19 vaccines.*¹⁶ The science has always supported natural immunity. Persons with evidence of prior infection from illnesses such as measles, mumps, rubella, and chicken pox are considered immune and not recommended to receive a vaccine dose.^{17 18} Natural immunity has been shown to be so powerful that after 90 years, persons who recovered from the Spanish flu pandemic of 1918-1919 still had protective immunity.¹⁹ Persons with natural immunity must be exempted from vaccine mandates that offer them no additional benefit and have the very real possibility of placing them at risk of injury or even death. This includes individuals who recovered without seeking verification of illness from a health care provider.

All COVID-19 vaccines are liability-free pharmaceutical products and those who are injured or die as a result of receipt of these products have no legal recourse. Employers are mandating these products, yet at this time, they will not be held responsible for damages should these products injure or kill. It is imperative that employers be held liable for any mandates imposed as a condition of employment. Currently, those harmed by COVID-19 vaccines can only file for compensation with the Countermeasures Injury Compensation Program or CICIP. This woefully inadequate program will offer little compensation to those who are harmed and most people who file will have their claim denied, with no option to appeal the decision. For those rare individuals who receive compensation, the claim will take years to process. The CICIP is the payor of last resort and will only pay out the difference of what is not compensated by other payor sources.²⁰ As of November 1, 2021, there have been 4,751 COVID-19 countermeasures claims filed, with 2,297 claims for vaccine injuries, and 2,454 claims for COVID-19 related treatments. In the past 12 months, the program has only managed to process 4 out of the 4,751 filed claims. Three claims were denied and one was approved. This one approved claim, however, has not received any compensation because the government is waiting until every other payor source has paid out before determining whether there are any outstanding expenses that will require compensation. Given that claims for COVID-19 vaccine and countermeasures injuries are currently being processed at a rate of one case every three months, one can only imagine how long it will take for the backlog of claims to be processed.²¹ NVIC supports SB721 as it will allow for those harmed by COVID-19 vaccines to seek compensation directly from the entity that mandated this invasive medical procedure as a condition of employment.

Hundreds of thousands of Wisconsinites have naturally acquired immunity to SARS-CoV-2. Many developed natural immunity because they chose to show up for work. Our front-line health care workers who cared for the sick and dying, at times without adequate personal protective equipment, were last year's heroes. This year, they are facing termination and have been villainized for choosing not to receive the COVID-19 vaccine. The health care worker shortages have now prompted the CDC to publish guidelines which allow COVID-19 positive healthcare workers, including those with symptoms, to work while infected.²² Yet we have major healthcare systems such as the Mayo Clinic Health System firing hundreds of unvaccinated health care workers and claiming that they are doing so to keep patients and communities safe.²³ How safe are our patients and communities when we don't have an adequate number of health care providers to care for those in need and we put their lives at risk by allowing them to be cared for by workers who are sick with COVID-19?

Our essential workforce did not have the option to work from home. They put their health and lives at risk to ensure that essential services remained available in our state. Our retail and grocery store workers, those who stocked the shelves and ensured that our Wisconsin families had food available to purchase, were willing to work during the height of the pandemic. They shopped for and delivered products to high-risk individuals and to those who chose to refrain from entering public spaces. Our police, firefighters, and EMTs responded to emergencies throughout the pandemic. In addition, it is certainly worth mentioning the thousands of individuals employed in our manufacturing sector, along with those who delivered products throughout our state and country. Now many of those same individuals are facing the prospects of losing their jobs for declining the COVID-19 vaccine even though many are already immune because they showed up to work. Our workforce should not be mandated liability-free pharmaceutical products as a condition of employment. Given the absence of protections in the law to prevent these mandates, NVIC supports SB547 which would provide assistance through unemployment benefits to those unjustly fired for declining to receive a liability-free pharmaceutical product that is incapable of stopping transmission and infection. Many Wisconsin children and families will suffer undue hardship if individuals are denied unemployment benefits. This is unjust and harmful and should not be tolerated in our great state.

In conclusion, I respectfully request that this committee adopt the language of both Assembly Amendments of AB675 into SB662 and request that you vote in favor of SB547 and SB721.

**Official Written Testimony in favor of
SB 547, Assembly Substitute Amendment 1- to Assembly Bill 675 / SB662, and SB721
Senate Committee on Labor and Regulatory Reform
Tuesday, January 11th, 2022
Tara Czachor of Wisconsin United For Freedom**

Thank you, Chairman Nass, and committee members for holding a public hearing for SB547, SB662, and SB721. We are very apologetic in that we cannot attend today's hearing in person.

My name is Tara Czachor, and I am submitting our official testimony on behalf of Wisconsin United For Freedom, in support of SB 547, in support of the **Assembly Substitute Amendment 1 for AB675 that has not yet been introduced for SB662**, and in support of SB721.

As a state organization, we stand for vaccine choice for every man, woman, and child in Wisconsin. Over the past legislative session, there have been over **11** protective legislative bills regarding vaccinations introduced in our Wisconsin State Legislature. We are grateful that we have legislators working hard for the people of Wisconsin, however, we are also calling for better communication between the Senate and the Assembly leadership in order to place a strong bill to protect Wisconsinites on Gov. Ever's desk--whether he signs it or not will be up to him.

We founded this organization as mothers, to stand up against legislative policies that are morally and ethically wrong, so that our children may grow up in the land of the free and home of the brave, without having to show our papers in order to provide for our families or enter a concert hall or restaurant.

In the last 20 months, we have seen a rise in awareness of social injustices, yet we sit here today, as government officials in several states, encouraged by our federal government, have required businesses to kick children and mothers of color out of restaurants, as they failed to show their proof of COVID-19 vaccination¹. We are Wisconsin mothers, and we refuse to stand by and watch as these policies slowly creep throughout our country into our great state of Wisconsin.

None of these bills have anything to do with whether someone should or should not receive a vaccine against the SARS-CoV-2 coronavirus. We do not advocate for or against any medical treatments. We do advocate for truth, transparency, openness, honesty, informed consent, bodily autonomy, and the right to choose or not choose this medical procedure.

We support SB547, which would help Wisconsinites if they were to be met with coercive and discriminatory policies that threaten their livelihoods, and push them to take an injection, with both known and unknown risks, in order to maintain their employment.

We support SB662, if the Assembly Substitute Amendment 1 for AB675 is added to this Senate Bill 662. This bill provides that if an employer requires an employee to provide proof of having received a vaccine against COVID-19, or to be regularly tested for COVID-19 as a condition of continued employment or an offer of employment, the employer is required to accept, in lieu of proof of such vaccination or regular testing, documentation demonstrating natural immunity against the SARS-CoV-2 coronavirus—either documentation showing that the individual tested positive for COVID-19 or documentation of a serology test that shows the presence of naturally occurring antibodies against SARS-CoV-2 in the individual's blood.

The provisions under the assembly substitute amendment 1 include that the documentation could be:

“A notarized letter written by the individual that states that the individual, to the best of the individual's knowledge, recovered from COVID-19.”

This piece of the amendment is important, especially because early on in the pandemic, testing was not as available as it is now. Many people had COVID-19, but were unable to access a test in order to obtain documentation of a positive diagnosis. The other piece of this, is that some people may not show antibodies against SARS-CoV-2, however, upon re-exposure, they would. These tests are both just a blip in time, and it is important to note that many Wisconsinites had symptoms of COVID-19 early on, but no proof of positive test or presence of antibodies.

The amendment also states that:

“No employer may discriminate against an employee who provides evidence of natural immunity under sub. (2) in the individual's employment, including requiring the employee to self-isolate, wear a face covering, or work in an area outside of the employee's usual work area if the employer does not require the same of employees who provide proof of vaccination or who undergo regular testing for COVID-19.”

It is imperative that the Wisconsin State Legislature help ensure fair and equal treatment of Wisconsinites, and our organization stands firmly on the side of equal treatment with regards to vaccine status. If the assembly substitute amendment 1 were not to pass, our organization would no longer be in favor of SB662. We also encourage language to be written into this bill to also require that the employer inform the employee about their rights under this law so that employees have all the information they may need in order to follow this process. This is written into the Assembly Substitute Amendment 1 as well. Transparency and openness are key.

We also support SB721, which would pass on liability to employers should they mandate or coerce an employee to receive a COVID-19 vaccine. Currently, the vaccine manufacturers, our government, and vaccine administrators are not held liable if the vaccines they are mandating or injecting cause serious harm or death to the individual.

To be extremely open and honest, we are extremely stunned and much of the time barely recognize what is occurring in our country right now. It is incredibly unfortunate that we are at a point in time where we need our State Legislature to help protect the fundamental rights we have as Americans to live freely, move around freely, and participate in living out our American Dream – whether vaccinated or not.

We must “follow the science,” and the science shows both vaccinated and those who opt out, are becoming infected with and transmitting COVID-19, and therefore, there should be equal treatment under the law.
