SUBJECT: Modified Plan for Learning Loss Funds under State ESSER III Plan

This memorandum provides information about the modified plan for funding under the third round of the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) fund under the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA).

Background

ARPA was enacted by the federal government on March 11, 2021. The Act uses the education stabilization fund framework created under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act to provide additional aid for K-12 and higher education totaling \$165.1 billion. Of that amount, \$122.8 billion is designated as a third round of funding for the ESSER fund, of which \$1,540.8 million is allocated for Wisconsin.

Under ARPA, 90% percent of Wisconsin's total ESSER III funding (or \$1,386.7 million) must be distributed directly to local educational agencies (LEAs) according to the formula used for the distribution of funds under Title I, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, which is based on a census count of the number and percentage of low-income pupils residing in each district. Of the remaining funds, at least 7% must be allocated as follows: (a) at least 5% must be allocated to carry out activities to address learning loss through the implementation of evidence-based interventions, such as summer learning or enrichment, extended day, comprehensive after-school programs, or extended school year programs; (b) at least 1% must be allocated to implement evidence-based summer enrichment programs; and (c) at least 1% must be allocated to implement evidence-based comprehensive after-school programs. The remaining funds are available for discretionary use for education-related purposes.

Under s. 115.295, the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) is required to submit a plan to the Joint Committee on Finance if the Department estimates that the amount of federal funds that will be appropriated in the current state fiscal year is less than 95% or more than 105% of the amount

of federal revenue shown in the Chapter 20 schedule for that year. The plan must identify how the federal appropriations will be adjusted to reflect the most recent estimate of federal funds that will be received. The plan is submitted to the Co-Chairs of the Joint Committee on Finance, who send it to Committee members upon determining that it is complete.

Plan for ESSER III Funding Under Motion 57

DPI submitted a plan for the additional federal funds received under ARPA on April 1, 2021. The Joint Committee on Finance met to modify and approve the plan by adopting Motion 57 on May 27, 2021.

Under Motion 57, 90% of funds (\$1,386.7 million) were allocated for distribution directly to LEAs according to the formula used for the distribution of Title I Part A funds under the ESEA, as required under ARPA.

A competitive grant program was established using the funds earmarked for summer learning and after school programming (totaling \$30.8 million) under which only districts that met the eligibility criteria for sparsity aid in the 2020-21 school year would be eligible in the first round of funding. Any LEA would be eligible to apply for funds remaining after the first round of grants.

The learning loss earmark funds (\$77.0 million) and a portion of the state discretionary funds (\$37.6 million) were combined under the motion to create an in-person schooling incentive. Under this part of the motion, a per pupil minimum grant award of \$781 would be established for any LEA that meets the following criteria: (a) received less than \$781 per pupil under the initial allocation of ESSER III funds; and (b) provided in-person instruction in the 2020-21 school year for at least 50% of the total instructional hours provided by the LEA. Any remaining funds under this portion of the funding would be distributed proportionally among LEAs that otherwise would receive less than \$781 under the initial allocation of ARPA funds. The amount of aid received by each LEA would be calculated by dividing the number of in-person instructional hours provided by the LEA in the 2020-21 school year by the total number of in-person instructional hours provided by all eligible LEAs, with that proportion multiplied by the total amount of available funding to determine each LEA's allocation.

The remainder of the state discretionary funds were allocated as follows: (a) \$5.0 million for a reading program, including funding for an analysis of educator preparation programs, professional development in literacy, and grants to UW System educator preparation programs; (b) \$2.1 million for the state's residential schools for blind and deaf pupils, the Syble Hopp School operated by the Brown County Children with Disabilities Board, and the Lakeland School operated by the Walworth County Children with Disabilities Board; (c) \$1.2 million to fund administration of the federal grant program; and (d) an estimated \$0.3 million to Lincoln Academy, an independent charter school located in Beloit, for payments totaling \$781 per pupil enrolled in September, 2021.

The table below shows ESSER III allocations under Motion 57.

Federal Government Response to ESSER III Plan

ARPA required states to submit an application for ESSER III funds to the federal Department of Education (USDE), which must be approved prior to the final release of funds under the act. Wisconsin's state application was submitted on August 27, 2021.

On December 6, 2021, USDE issued a letter to DPI approving the majority of Wisconsin's state plan, with the exception of the use of the \$77.0 million in learning loss earmark funds for the in-person incentive. The ARPA application requires states to identify the evidence-based interventions that would be funded using the earmark funds, demonstrate how the interventions would address the disproportionate impact of the pandemic on particular pupil groups (including low-income pupils, minority pupils, English learners, and pupils with disabilities), and describe how the earmark funds would be used to identify and engage pupils who missed the most in-person instruction during the 2019-20 and 2020-21 school years and pupils who did not consistently participate in remote instruction when offered. The USDE letter indicated that excluding LEAs that did not provide in-person instruction for at least 50% of total instructional hours from the learning loss funds would not fulfill ARPA requirements to use the funds to address the academic impact of lost instructional time on pupils who missed the most in-person instruction and on specified pupil groups. The letter required DPI to revise its application with a modified plan for use of the learning loss funds that will not exclude LEAs on the basis of in-person instructional hours. The letter also directed DPI to work with USDE to make technical changes to the reading program portion of the Motion 57 plan.

Modified ESSER III Plan

On January 13, 2022, DPI submitted a modified ESSER III plan to the Committee for the portion of the Motion 57 plan that was not approved by the federal government (\$77.0 million in learning loss earmark funds). The remaining allocations under the Motion 57 plan were approved by USDE without requiring changes, and are not addressed in the modified plan.

Under the modified plan, the \$77.0 million would be allocated as follows:

- (a) \$67,092,872 for minimum aid to provide additional funds to LEAs that received lesser amounts under the initial ESSER III allocation based on the Title I Part A formula. Under these funds, if the amount received under the LEA's initial allocation is less than \$578 per pupil (based on 2020-21 enrollment) or \$320,863 total, additional funds would be allocated so that the LEA's allocation reaches the greater of those amounts. For LEAs with fewer than 25 pupils, the minimum total award would be \$200,000.
- (b) \$5,000,000 for a competitive grant program under which LEAs and community-based organizations could apply for funding for out-of-school time programming, such as after-school and summer school programs.
- (c) \$5,000,000 for a program under which the Graduation Alliance would work with LEAs to identify and work with high school pupils who have been chronically absent from school during the COVID-19 pandemic. Pupils would be connected with a personal academic coach who would re-engage them with school and help them get back on track to graduate from high school.

The remaining in-person incentive funds (\$37.7 million) would allow for minimum per pupil funding of \$400 for LEAs that meet the 50% in-person threshold. Funds remaining after each eligible LEA's per pupil ESSER III allocation is increased to \$400 would be distributed proportionately among LEAs that otherwise would receive less than \$781 under the initial allocation of ARPA funds, as under Motion 57. The amount of aid received by each LEA would be calculated by dividing the number of in-person instructional hours provided by the LEA in the 2020-21 school year by the total number of in-person instructional hours provided by all eligible LEAs. Under the plan, 63 school districts and five independent charter schools would qualify for funding totaling \$29.7 million in the first round of in-person funding calculations, and 149 school districts and two independent charter schools would receive funding totaling \$8.0 million in the second round.

The plan also modifies the reading program timelines as follows:

- (a) Extends the deadline for CESAs and LEAs to use funds to attend the Voyager Sopris Language Essentials for Teachers of Reading and Spelling (LETRS) training from June 1, 2022, to December 1, 2022, which would extend the reimbursement period through December 1, 2023. A waiver would be requested to ensure that grants could be awarded through 2023;
- (b) Specifies that professional development for principals and administrators in early literacy could be provided in the 2021-22 or 2022-23 school years, rather than only the 2021-22 school year;

- (c) Extends the deadline to award grant money to CESAs 8 and 9 for evidence-based literacy trainings from July 31, 2021, to July 31, 2022;
- (d) For the landscape analysis of reading programs in UW System schools, specifies that DPI would issue a request for bids/proposals by May 1, 2022, for the purpose of retaining an organization that would conduct a landscape analysis of reading programs by June 1, 2022;
- (e) For the grant awards for UW schools that participate in the landscape analysis, specifies that DPI would request a waiver to ensure that funds could be awarded through 2023; and
- (f) Specifies that for any reading program funds that would be reallocated to reimburse school districts and CESAs for direct course costs for an accredited independent teacher training program endorsed by the Center for Effective Reading Instruction or competitive grants for CESAs to expand evidence-based audits, instruction, and coaching, a waiver would be requested to ensure that funds could be awarded through 2023.

The attachment shows total federal coronavirus aid funding for LEAs, including final allocations under GEER I, ESSER I, ESSER II (including the in-person incentive funding), ESSER III initial allocations, and the additional ESSER III funding allocation under this proposal. Once approved by the Committee, the proposal is subject to final approval by the federal USDE.

The modified plan was submitted to the Co-Chairs on January 18, 2022. The plan was determined to be complete by the Co-Chairs on January 19, 2022. It is now subject to a 14-day passive review (14 calendar days), although the Committee could waive this time period if it wishes to approve the plan prior to its expiration.
