



**ASSEMBLY SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1,
TO 1995 ASSEMBLY BILL 280**

October 27, 1995 - Offered by Representative UNDERHEIM.

1 **AN ACT** *to renumber* 448.51; *to amend* 448.52 (intro.); and *to create* 446.02
2 (10), 448.51 (2) and 448.525 of the statutes; **relating to:** persons who may claim
3 to render physical therapy or physiotherapy services and granting
4 rule-making authority.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

5 **SECTION 1.** 446.02 (10) of the statutes is created to read:
6 446.02 **(10)** (a) The examining board and the physical therapists affiliated
7 credentialing board acting under s. 448.525 shall jointly promulgate rules that
8 establish the circumstances under which and the extent to which a chiropractor
9 licensed under this chapter may claim to render physical therapy or physiotherapy
10 services within the scope of the practice of chiropractic.
11 (b) The examining board may promulgate rules relating to the circumstances
12 under which and the extent to which a chiropractor licensed under this chapter may
13 claim to render physical therapy or physiotherapy services within the scope of the
14 practice of chiropractic only as provided under par. (a).

1 **SECTION 2.** 448.51 of the statutes is renumbered 448.51 (1).

2 **SECTION 3.** 448.51 (2) of the statutes is created to read:

3 448.51 (2) (a) In this subsection, “advertisement” includes advertisements that
4 appear on outdoor signs, in print or electronic media, and in material mailed to a
5 person other than a patient or prospective patient who has requested the material.

6 (b) Except as provided in par. (c), no person may claim to render physical
7 therapy or physiotherapy services unless the person is licensed under this
8 subchapter.

9 (c) A chiropractor licensed under ch. 446 may claim to render physical therapy
10 or physiotherapy services only as follows:

11 1. In accordance with the rules promulgated under ss. 446.02 (10) and 448.525.

12 2. If the rules under ss. 446.02 (10) and 448.525 have not taken effect, as
13 follows:

14 a. If, anytime before October 17, 1995, the chiropractor claimed in an
15 advertisement to render physical therapy or physiotherapy services, the
16 chiropractor may continue to claim to render physical therapy or physiotherapy
17 services in an advertisement until the rules promulgated under ss. 446.02 (10) and
18 448.525 take effect.

19 b. The chiropractor may claim to render physical therapy or physiotherapy
20 services in private communications with an individual who is a patient or
21 prospective patient until the rules promulgated under ss. 446.02 (10) and 448.525
22 take effect. This subd. 2. b. also applies to an employe or agent of the chiropractor
23 who claims that the chiropractor renders physical therapy or physiotherapy services.
