

EXECUTIVE ORDER -11

PROVIDING FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF LAW AND ORDER IN THE STATE OF WISCONSIN,
CITY OF MADISON, AND ON THE STATE CAPITOL BUILDING AND GROUNDS

WHEREAS, the Secretary of the Department of Administration of the State of Wisconsin, other reliable State officials, officers of the National Guard on duty on the State Capitol grounds, and law enforcement officials of the City of Madison and Dane County have advised me that the conditions of domestic violence, disorder, and resistance to the execution of the laws of this State continue to exist; and

WHEREAS, such acts of violence and resistance to the law threaten the safety of the State Capitol Building and grounds and prevent the continuance of normal governmental functions on those premises;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, WARREN P. KNOWLES, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby order the following, effective from 4:30 p.m., October 2, 1969, until my further notice:

1. It is ordered that loitering, sleeping, or camping anywhere on the Capitol grounds is prohibited.
2. It is further ordered that the presence on the State Capitol grounds of persons not employed at the State Capitol or on official and necessary business as determined by the reasonable guidelines established by the Department of Administration, or duly authorized law enforcement officers engaged in the policing of the State Capitol building and its grounds, is prohibited.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Wisconsin to be affixed. Done at the Capitol in the City of Madison this second day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-nine.
